

PARENT INFORMATION



All campers must have standing orders signed by a physician on file.
(This is on the backside of the camper registration)

All medications must come in **original prescription bottle with proper dosage labeled** and must be turned in to the Fowler Nurse at registration. You will need to bring written authorization stating times nurse should administer medication.

New York State Department of Health guidelines state that food shall not be kept in cabins.
Do not bring or send food and candy.

Check-in time is **2:30 p.m.** on Sunday. When picking up or dropping off campers, overnight accommodations are available in Chi Rho House, campsites or cabins. Contact the main office (518) 374-4573.
Pick up time is at **10:00 a.m.** on Saturday morning.

Worship is Sunday at **10:30 a.m.** in the Chapel-by-the-Lake. All are welcome.

DIRECTIONS TO FOWLER

FROM AMSTERDAM

Follow Rte. 30 north to Speculator, a distance of approximately 45 miles. In Speculator, turn left on Rte. 8. After a distance of about 2 1/2 miles you come to Pelcher Rd. Look for a sign on your right FOWLER CAMP AND RETREAT CENTER.

At the Fowler sign, turn right. About 1 mile, a sign will direct you right to the center of camp and registration. To the left is Chi Rho House.

FROM UTICA

Follow Rte 8 north for about 60 miles through the Village of Lake Pleasant. Turn left at the sign noted above.
